

NOTICE OF DISCONTINUANCE
FORD SUPER DUTY F-250 AND F-350
PROPOSED CLASS ACTION
(Court file number 155-06-00001-189)

Please Read This Notice Carefully. It May Affect Your Legal Rights.

Persons in Québec who own, owned, lease or leased one or more Ford Super Duty F-250 and/or F-350 automobiles from the years 2011 to 2017 are advised that:

On January 10, 2018, a class action was commenced in Quebec against Ford Motor Company and Ford Motor Company of Canada, Limited (collectively "**Ford**") and Robert Bosch GmbH, Robert Bosch LLC and Robert Bosch Inc. (collectively "**Bosch**" and together collectively the "**Defendants**") regarding diesel emission testing. The class action Plaintiff alleges that the Defendants equipped the subject vehicles with illegal defeat devices were installed, causing the vehicles to emit significantly higher levels of emissions under common driving conditions than those advertised and permitted by Law.

The Defendants deny these allegations, which have not been tested before the Court.

You are receiving this notice because you previously inquired with Siskinds Desmeules in respect of this class action.

Siskinds Desmeules is of the opinion that the proposed Ford Super Duty F-250 and F-350 proceeding is no longer viable, and the representative plaintiff no longer wishes to pursue the claim against the Defendants. On this basis, Siskinds Desmeules sought and obtained the approval of the Quebec Superior Court to discontinue the class proceeding.

YOU SHOULD TAKE NOTICE that the limitation period for bringing a claim, if there is any time left within it, will recommence on May 3, 2023. On the expiry of the limitation period, your right to sue may be extinguished. Limitation periods may vary from one person to another. You may wish to consult your own lawyer about this.
