

Subject: Action collective concernant UberWAV – Class Action re UberWAV

DO NOT REPLY – This is an automated message.

We are contacting you in accordance with the Superior Court of Québec judgment dated August 7, 2025 (case number 500-06-001310-248) which authorized Mr. Laurent Morissette to act as class representative in a class action against Uber Technologies, Inc., Uber Holdings Canada Inc. and Uber Canada Inc. (hereafter “**Uber**”).

Through this class action, Mr. Morissette alleges that Uber excludes persons with physical handicaps that use either a non-foldable motorized wheelchair, a non-foldable walker or a non-foldable mobility scooter, from their transportation ride services, contrary to the Québec *Charter of Human Rights and Freedoms*, CQLR c C-12 and the *Consumer Protection Act*, CQLR c P-40.1.

Uber contests these allegations. The court has not yet decided whether Mr. Morissette’s claim is well-founded, and the allegations made in the class action have not yet been proven. A trial will be held at a later date to allow the parties to present their evidence and arguments.

You are a member of the class action if you:

1. You reside in the province of Quebec and live with a physical handicap affecting your mobility requiring the use of a non-foldable wheelchair, non-foldable walker (and cannot enter a vehicle independently) and/or non-foldable scooter, and were refused access to Uber’s transportation services between May 28, 2021 and August 7, 2025.

and/or

2. You reside in the region of Montreal and live with a physical handicap affecting your mobility requiring the use of a non-foldable wheelchair, non-foldable walker (and who cannot enter a vehicle independently) and/or non-foldable scooter, and were refused access to Uber WAV services after a direct representation, or after any form of publicity to the effect that Uber WAV was a service offered, available and adapted for accessibility between October 1, 2022 and August 7, 2025.

You may opt out of the class action by sending a letter to the Clerk of the Superior Court of Québec (mentioning the case number above), as described in more detail in the Notice of Authorization of a Class Action available [here](#). The deadline to opt out of the class action is **June 29th, 2026**.
